**Carolyn Maloney** has represented the 14th Congressional District since 1993. Congresswoman Maloney is Chair of the House Financial Services Committee's Financial Institutions Subcommittee, which has jurisdiction over the nation's banking system. Ms. Maloney is also a senior member of the House Oversight and Government Reform Committee.



**Ester R. Fuchs** is a Professor of Public Affairs and Political Science at Columbia University. Ms. Fuchs has served as Special Advisor to the Mayor for Governance and Strategic Planning under New York City Mayor Michael R. Bloomberg from 2001-2005. Dr. Fuchs was also appointed by Mayor Bloomberg to serve as Chair of the 2005 NYC Charter Revision Commission. Professor Fuchs was recently appointed to the Committee on Economic Inclusion of the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation (FDIC).
